

About the Internal Quality Assurance Cell

In pursuance of the National Action Plan of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation of institutions of higher education, the NAAC proposed that every accredited institution establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC will become a part of an institution's system and work towards realizing the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of institutions. The IQAC will make a significant and meaningful contribution in the post-accreditation phase of institutions. During the post-accreditation period, the IQAC will channelize the efforts and measures of an institution towards academic excellence.

With a vision to build and ensure a quality culture aimed at all round excellence at the institutional level, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was established in Shri Ram College of Commerce. By keeping the idea of service quality at its core, the IQAC aims to develop and progress a heightened level of clarity and focus in institutional functioning towards creation, sustenance and enhancement of quality. This would facilitate internalization of such a culture permeating every sphere of the College by better decision making, greater coordination amongst the constituents of College and enhanced communication with its stakeholders.

The work of the IQAC is an additional step towards internalization and institutionalization of quality enhancement initiatives. Building on the growth oriented direction of the College, the IQAC will foster a sense of belongingness and participation in all the constituents of the institution. Employing its potential to become a vehicle for ushering in quality enhancement, the IQAC will work out interventionist strategies to remove deficiencies and enhance quality in the institution akin to “Quality Circles” in industries.

The IQAC in Shri Ram College of Commerce has integrated the various functional units required for efficient and effective functioning of the College viz. Faculty from all courses, Administration, Accounts and Library. Each of these units contribute to the holistic development of institution and the students. The IQAC coordinates these units into a single direction oriented for the qualitative development of academic and administrative standards in the College. A facilitative and participative voluntary organ of the institution, the IQAC combines the synergies of each of the interlinked constituents in the process of planning, development, assurance and monitoring of quality in the College.



In these fields, the IQAC is developing parameters for excellence in quality as well as establishing a monitoring mechanism in place. The IQAC is also aiming to strengthen the Governance mechanism in the College by joint decision making efforts on the above focus areas. The IQAC also aims at creation of a participatory environment by setting up of various feedback mechanisms in the College .

As a part of its future plans, the IQAC also intends to engage student representatives in its constitution to facilitate direct inclusion of the student community in its broad policy framework of the College.

Functions of the IQAC

1. Development and application of quality benchmarks/parameters for the various academic and administrative activities of the College.
2. Facilitating the creation of a learner-centric environment conducive for quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for participatory teaching and learning process.
3. Arrangement for feedback responses from students, parents and other stakeholders on quality-related institutional processes.
4. Dissemination of information on the various quality parameters of higher education.
5. Organization of inter and intra institutional workshops, seminars on quality related themes and promotion of quality circles.
6. Documentation of the various programmes/activities of the College, leading to quality improvement.
7. Acting as a nodal agency of the College for coordinating quality-related activities, including adoption and dissemination of good practices.
8. Development and maintenance of Institutional database through MIS for the purpose of maintaining/enhancing the institutional quality.
9. Development of Quality Culture in the College.
10. Preparation of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) of the College based on the quality parameters/assessment criteria developed by the relevant quality assurance body (like NAAC, NBA, AB) in the prescribed format.
11. Bi-annual development of Quality Radars (QRs) and Ranking of Integral Units of the College based on the AQAR.
12. Interaction with SQACs in the pre and post accreditation quality assessment, sustenance and enhancement endeavours.
13. In terms of UGC Regulations 2010, IQAC shall act as the Documentation and Record-Keeping cell.

Major Events of the College

NAAC Peer Team Visit

With the submission of the Self-Study Report in 2015, a four member NAAC team had visited the College in August, 2016. The members of the NAAC Peer team were:

- ❖ **Prof. Dr. Thavamani**, Pro-Vice Chancellor, Periyar Maniammai University and Former Principal, Ethiraj College for Women and Member Coordinator for the NAAC peer team;
- ❖ **Prof. Dr. Ashok Aima**, Chairperson, NAAC peer team, and former Vice Chancellor, Central University of Jammu;
- ❖ **Prof. Nageshwar Rao**, Vice Chancellor, Uttarakhand Open University; and
- ❖ **Prof. A. R. Tripathi**, Dean, Faculty of Commerce, Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi.

The three day visit involved interactions with various functionaries of the College and assessment of various facilities of the College. The first day started with an interaction with a broad presentation highlighting the College's salient features by Dr. R. P. Rustagi, Principal, SRCC which was followed by presentation of the Dr. Rachna Jawa, Coordinator, Internal Quality Assurance Cell defining the key efforts of the IQAC in development and progress of the College. The Peer team then interacted with the IQAC members followed by the an interaction with the faculty members of the respective Departments of the College. This was followed by an interaction with the students and society representatives of twenty-seven societies where they highlighted the work done by them.

The Peer team was then taken to the Auditorium where they were greeted by the 'The Grandeur of SRCC', a exhibition-cum-display of various societies showcasing the events and activities undertaken on a regular basis throughout the year. The Grandeur provided a visual spectacle into the efforts put by the societies in the holistic development of student's personalities in the College





The first day concluded with the cultural programme 'Phylogeny' in the College auditorium showcasing the life of a student who enters the premises of the College, walks through the canvas of life and emerges out as a transformed individual.



On the second day, the peer team was apprised of the GBO programme where they interacted with its faculty and students. This was followed by a visit to the various Centres of the College such as Centre for Green Initiatives, National Centre for Corporate Governance. The Peer Team also visited various facilities and cells in the Tutorial Block such as the **Anti-Ragging Cell, Internal Complaints Committee and IQAC**. They also interacted with the Convenors and student coordinators of **National Service Scheme, Office of International Programme and the Placement Cell**. The peer team then visited the functional units of the college viz. the Library, the Resource Center for Visually Challenged and the Sports Complex. The team also took note of the rooms, mess and various facilities available in both the Girls' and Boys' Hostel.

The third day started with a meeting of the peer team with the Governing body members headed by the Chairman, Mr. Ajay S Shriram. The Peer team discussed various issues with the Governing Body. The visit ended with an 'exit meeting' in the Seminar Room of the College where the Chairperson of the NAAC Peer team, Prof. Ashok Aima shared his observations followed by a few suggestions for the College. International Events at SRCC

International Conference on Advances in Business and Information Technology & Doctoral Colloquium held in Kigali, Rwanda, Africa

A two days International Conference on Advances in Business and Information Technology & Doctoral Colloquium at Kigali, Rwanda (Africa) was held in the month of March. Dr. Anil Kumar, Associate Professor, Shri Ram College of Commerce and Conference Co-Chair delivered the Keynote Address on Corporate Governance in Family Businesses at the Conference. Overall thirty-five research papers in six technical sessions relating to various aspects of business and information technology were presented by the academicians. It allowed the presenters to gain a deeper insight into various topics. Four faculty members from our College presented their research papers in the Conference, namely Mr. S.K. Choudhury, Dr. Vandana Jain, Ms. Renu Bansal and Ms. Richa Goel. The research paper presented by Dr. Vandana Jain, Assistant Professor SRCC was adjudged the "best paper" of the conference.

Global Millennium Summit, Dubai

SRCC Global Millennium Summit was a first-of-its-kind international Summit organized by the students of SRCC under the guidance of Dr. Mallika Kumar (Faculty Coordinator, Office of International Programmes) in the month of March in Dubai. The theme of the Summit was 'Future of the Millennium' which entailed speaker sessions, panel discussions, workshops and competitions centering on Entrepreneurship, Banking, Smart cities and Technology. Summit saw participation from over two hundred student delegates from 20+ countries and was a huge success.

Global Sustainability Summit, Delhi

SRCC faculty, students help underprivileged manage finances


