### **11.Significant contributions made by IQAC during the current year (maximum five bullets)**

Teaching-Learning: The IQAC organized several workshops, speaker sessions, and guest lectures on Contemporary Issues in Commerce, Management & Economics, and other multidisciplinary areas, such as leadership, communication, sustainability, circular economy, blue economy, gendered digital divide, and behavioral finance amongst others to expand the horizons of learning and knowledge of students and faculty members. For example, on 8th August, 2021, the IQAC organized a webinar in collaboration with Toastmasters International on "Communication, Public Speaking & Leadership". A webinar on "Case Solving & Guesstimates" was organised on 20th August, 2021. On 24th August, 2021, the IQAC organized a webinar on "How to deal with anxiety and FOMO in college?". The IQAC also organized a webinar on "Roadmap to UPSC" on 10th October, 2021. A webinar on "Demystifying Fintech" was organised by IQAC in collaboration with JIMS on 30th January, 2022, highlighting the importance of data analytics in finance & international business areas. These events and activities featured industry experts and experienced leaders and helped provided a more applied perspective to the large number of students and faculty participants. On the recommendation of the IQAC, the GBO programme of the College also adopted a two-faculty model of teaching-learning where subjects were taught by both seasoned industry representatives and academic faculty. This provides the students with a blend of theoretical as well as applied learning.

Research Promotion: On the recommendations of the IQAC, the scheme of the Center for Academic Excellence of SRCC was revised to include faculty members on ad-hoc basis as well as to increase the scope and amount of reimbursement for research. This is expected to further incentivize students, teaching, and non-teaching staff members to undertake research. The IQAC also organized several lecture series, workshops, and an International Conference during the year to provide numerous avenues of learning and research for students, faculty, and research scholars both within and beyond the College. For example, the IQAC organized a session on "Research Paper Writing" on 30th September, 2021 having 80+ participants, involving discussion on various issues & tools involved in research & data analysis like systematic research, research ethics, plagiarism, Google Scholar, and MS Excel, amongst other topics.

Administration and Student Engagement: With a view to expanding the communication channels and increasing the effectiveness of administration, especially administrative communication, the IQAC undertook initiatives to advance the digital interfaces of the

College such as its Student Management System. Several modules such as grievance management, internal assessment management, infrastructure, and IT management were introduced as a result of these initiatives, leading to higher stakeholder convenience through process simplification.

Environmental Care and Sustainability: The IQAC undertook the initiative of having the Green Audit of the College. Based on the Green Audit, the Institution took several measures to expand the environmental profile of the College, including expanding its rainwater harvesting system. As a result of the efforts taken towards the Environmental Care and sustainability, Shri Ram College of Commerce was recognized as the District Green Champion and Swachhta Action Plan Institution by the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India for the academic year 2021-22.

To improve the quality of teaching-learning and outcomes in the College.	For its Post Graduate Diploma in Global Business Operations (PGDGBO) programme, the IQAC had recommended the hiring of faculty member having rich industry experience in their fields/visiting faculty holding senior positions. In view of this, two visiting faculty were employed for teaching for each subject taught in PGDGBO programme, such that one faculty was from industry/eminent institutions of higher education such as IIMs, and the other faculty was a senior faculty, usually from the College. This provided a much broader exposure to the students of the PGDGBO programme and improved the overall quality of the teaching- learning of the programme.
To strengthen the environmental sustainability framework in the College.	The IQAC had planned for Green Audit of the College with an aim to evaluate the adequacy of the management control framework of environmental sustainability. As such the Green Audit of the College was undertaken. Suggestions in the Audit Report were considered favourably by the College and implemented in the due course. As a result of the efforts taken towards the Environmental Care and sustaining, Shri Ram College of Commerce was recognised as the District Green Champion and Swachhta Action Plan Institution by the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of

Education, Government of India. The Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE), in the Department of Higher Education of the Ministry of Education Government of India is a nodal agency of the Ministry towards the Swachhta Abhiyaan. MGNCRE has promoted Swachhta and Sustainability Index activities including the modalities of handling water, waste, greenery, sanitation and energy in the Higher Education Institutions and the villages adopted by them. The MGNCRE awards "One District, One Green Champion" to acknowledge the proactive efforts of a few Higher Education Institutions towards implementation and achievement of goals of the Swachhta Action Plan. A team of experts from the MGNCRE visited the College in the month of October 2021 and evaluated the College on parameters such as Sanitation, Hygiene, Waste Management, Water Management, Energy Management and Greenery Management. Post evaluation, Shri Ram College of Commerce was recognized as District Green Champion for Central District, New Delhi for the Academic Year 2021-22 for successfully elevating the Swachhta Action Plan, adopting and implementing Best Practices in the areas of Sanitation, Hygiene, Waste Management, Water Management, Energy Management and Greenery Management. Shri Ram College of Commerce is also recognized as Swachhta Action Plan Institution. The College has

	<pre>successfully formed the Swachhta Action Plan Committee and constituted the working groups Post COVID-19 for Sanitation &amp; Hygiene, Waste Management, Water Management, Energy Management and Greenery along with the observation of two environment related days to inculcate in faculty, students and community, the practices of Swachhta and Reduction, Reuse and Recycling of Resources. To promulgate research culture and build research competencies in the College.	In pursuance of its objectives towards quality enhancement and promulgation of research culture and knowledge dissemination in the College, the IQAC SRCC organised a Ten-Day IQAC Research Series in July 2022. The IQAC Faculty Research Series was a pan-India research progranme held in virtual mode in which faculty members of Shri Ram College of Commerce showcased their research work on the themes of sustainability, marketing, finance and women in decision making amongst others. The outcome envisaged of the deliberations and discussions in the Faculty Research Series was that it would help enhance the knowledge and skills of faculty members and students in the Higher Education Institutions (HEI) in the country. The Global Business Operations programme also offers various courses to promote professional ethics and cultural understanding, such as `Social and Ethical Issues in Business', `Managing across Cultures', and `International Corporate Governance'. Even before the NEP 2020 mandate, SRCC has been proactively taking various steps towards the integration of Humanities and Social Sciences with Science and Technology through value-added/add-on courses being offered since 2018, thereby adding flexibility and innovation to the University's prescribed curricula.

During 2021-22, the College offered diverse add-on courses to its students such as 'Certificate Course in Foreign Language-French' in collaboration with Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi with Course duration of 125-150 hours and

'Certificate Course in Fundamental and Technical Analysis' by BSE Institute for about 30 hours. In view of NEP 2020, the College plans to launch additional multidisciplinary short-term courses in collaboration with the industry and professional bodies on themes such as Indian heritage, ancient Indian texts, legal literacy, practical knowledge about securities markets, and emotional intelligence. Further, SRCC follows a multifaceted approach toward the development of research culture, scientific temper, and aptitude among its students, teachers, and non-teaching staff members. To promote and incentivize research across various disciplines and pressing issues, the Centre for Academic Excellence at SRCC provides financial support to students and staff members for paper presentations, publications (books, research articles, working papers), and participation in Seminars, Conferences, Workshops, Training Programs, Debates, Leadership Programs, Field Trips, Industrial Visits, and Educational Visits at local, national, and international level. Moreover, the College seeks to collaborate with various Ministries, government organizations, and private institutions to offer research and consultancy services by the outstanding faculty members of SRCC. In addition to excellence in academics and research, our College has dedicated Student Societies/Cells/Units in the spheres of environmental sustainability (The Centre for Green Initiatives), community engagement & service (Enactus SRCC, Vittshala, NSS, Connecting Dreams Foundation), and value system as well as spirituality (Atman). Enactus SRCC has won several awards at national and international levels for their outstanding community service projects like Project Asbah, Virasat, Kayakalp, and many more social projects that require an understanding of real-world in diverse sectors.

#### 16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

As per the requirements of NEP 2020, multiple entry-exit options and credit transfer shall be allowed to the students across different recognized higher-education institutions (HEIs) located in different parts of the world. To ensure a seamless, hassle-free, and systematic credit transfer, the College shall establish an Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) which would digitally store the academic credits earned by a particular student from various recognized HEIs in India or outside India. Accordingly, the College would award Certificate/Diploma/Degree to the student taking into account all the credits earned across various HEIs. The certificate shall be awarded to a student who exits after completion of one year with requisite number of credits, diploma after two years, Bachelor's degree after three years, and degree with research after completion of the four-year programme. Thus, the Academic Bank of Credit shall

provide necessary flexibility and lifelong learning opportunities to the students. As and when recommended by the University of Delhi, the College will instruct the students to register themselves on the ABC portal (www.abc.gov.in). A centralized database, as well as the College's database, will be required in order to digitally store the academic credits earned by the student from several courses so that the credit secured by the student formerly could be passed on when the student enters into the programme again. In line with our vision to become a 'College of Global Choice' and to provide a global exposure to our students and teachers, SRCC has been continually collaborating and signing MOUs with various foreign universities and international institutions through its Office for International Programmes (OIP); for instance, Harvard US-India Initiative, EADA Business School (Spain), Melbourne University (Australia), Metropolitan College of New York (USA), IVEY Business School, University of Western Ontario (Canada), University of Warsaw (Poland), Gedu College of Business Studies, Royal University of Bhutan (Bhutan), and many more. The University of Delhi has been a pioneer in API-based certificate verification during the pandemic period. Since 2020, University has been using the nad.digitallocker.gov.in platform to upload students' mark sheets and degree certificates. The National Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) portal has now been integrated into the nad.digitallocker.gov.in platform and is presently operational for the academic year 2021-2022. On the whole, the College is ready to embrace the NEP 2020 in its true spirit and is well-equipped to handle the functional modalities involved therein. The Institution presently has the necessary prerequisites for the technical support system required to monitor ABC.

### **17.Skill development:**

One of the prime objectives of NEP 2020 is to expand the horizons and spread of vocational education in India through the introduction of the National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF). SRCC offers several vocational courses as short-term certificate courses to its students enrolled in Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes, while collaborating with various industries, professional bodies, and government agencies. Moreover, the College envisages to conduct add-on vocational courses in blended mode (both online and offline modes) to ensure greater reach and accessibility for the larger benefit of the student community. SRCC already has a designated Value-Added Courses (VAC) Committee that regularly offers Courses on contemporary areas to bridge the industry-academia gap. The course contents are meticulously drafted and deliberated through formal meetings to ensure maximum skill enhancement. The proposed value-

added courses are put before the students to gauge their interests. Based on their interest and infrastructural requirements of the proposed Course, the final decision is taken for its implementation. The VAC Committee has launched Courses such as <u>`Certificate Course</u> in Foreign Language-French' in collaboration with Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi with Course duration of 125-150 hours and 'Certificate Course in Fundamental and Technical Analysis' by BSE Institute for about 30 hours in present academic year to augment students' skills in line with corporate expectations, thus plugging the industry-academia gap. Further, contemporary topics such as Artificial Intelligence, Robotics, 3-D Printing, Internet of Things, Blockchains & Cryptocurrencies have also been covered under the umbrella of VAC. To facilitate students' learning experiences and problem-solving skills, various academic webinars, seminars, and workshops are being organized frequently. Students are also encouraged to undertake research and case studies and publish their findings through the support of Faculty mentors in an exclusive journal for SRCC students, 'Strides'. Some of the vibrant student-driven societies which enhance the intellectual capability of students include The Economics Society, The Computer and Mathematics Society, The Commerce Society, and Vittshala-The Financial Literacy Cell. Shri Ram Incubation Centre (SRIC), a student and faculty co-driven body promotes Innovation and Entrepreneurial skills. To further broaden the horizons of learning, the College has also launched 'One-week IQAC Faculty Lecture Series' and 'Distinguished Lecture Series' on contemporary themes such as 'Social Media Adoption and Performance Outcomes', 'Environmental Sustainability, Trade and Economic Growth in India', 'Community level CSR implementation through the lens of Institutional Theory', 'Destination Branding Model', 'Organizational Culture', and 'Globalization-Accounting Interface' to name a few. IQAC further plans to conduct a 2-day webinar on Stock Market (Intermediate to Advanced) to provide financial learning experiences to the participants, from renowned industry experts.

The outreach-committed societies such as 'NSS', 'Connecting Dreams Foundation' and 'Enactus', also help the students to gain multidisciplinary and cross-functional insights. By organizing annual students' conferences and festivals such as 'Business Conclave' and 'Crossroads', the students get hands-on experience of planning, conceptualizing, coordinating, and organizing public events. Additionally, the college's active interfaces such as academiaindustry, academia-academia, and institution-alumni also facilitate students to interact and engage with the finest personalities of academics, corporate, politics, sports, and arts amongst others, further resulting in the enhancement of their overall skill-sets. The College plans to offer vocational courses on pertinent themes such as Indian Knowledge System, Ancient Indian texts (like concept of dharma & karma as per the Bhagavad Gita), foreign languages, corporate social responsibility (CSR), ESG, sustainability, Nature/environment, etc. with an objective to inculcate soft skills, communication skills, technological skills, ethics, human values (like honesty, righteousness, integrity, non-violence, peace), constitutional values, and a sense of citizenship & social responsibility amongst the students.

**18.**Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The NEP 2020 lays extensive emphasis on the promotion of indigenous & regional languages, values, arts, culture, traditions, and traditional knowledge. In furtherance to the vision of NEP, our College plans to shortly launch a short-term programme on Indian Knowledge System (IKS) in partnership with professional bodies and experts such as Institute of Life Long Learning (ILLL), the Centre for IKS, along with NGOs specialized and focused upon promoting the Bhartiya Gyan Parampara and Gurukul system. The programme is envisaged to be multidisciplinary in nature, embracing a holistic approach to education, aimed at transforming the higher education system by widely acknowledging, disseminating, and familiarizing the participants with the amazing breadth, depth & richness of our Indian heritage and scientific ancient knowledge. The programme would cover a varied range of topics such as the Importance of Ancient Knowledge, Mind Management, Traditional System of Indian Trade, Ancient Public Administration & Governance Systems, Genius Minds of India, Ayurveda, Wellness, Spirituality, Indian Philosophies, and Psychology, along with the journey of Indian Knowledge System from awareness to its application. The IKS programme shall seek to cultivate cultural ethos, moral values, scientific temper, critical thinking, innovation, problem-solving attitude, along with fostering the creative, artistic, and cultural skills of participants. The College also promotes the use of Indian languages (such as Hindi, Sanskrit, etc.) besides English while encouraging Faculty to adopt a multilingual mode during lectures and tutorials. The institution already has a Hindi Department, which caters to papers specializing in Hindi Language offered to undergraduate students with the goal to inculcate an appreciation of Hindi language and literature and its relevance for the cultural development of students. To further promote the use of Hindi language, the institution has a society named 'Hindi Sahitya Sabha' in place which consists of faculty members and students as its members. The Society has conducted various seminars and cultural

programs to endorse Indian Culture and to disseminate the cultural values permeated by the literary works in Hindi. The Annual Magazine of the Institution 'Yamuna', too features several write-ups of students in both English as well as Hindi. Also, there is a specific course for the exam, called the 'Compulsory Test in Hindi' (CTH), which is compulsorily taken up by students who have not studied Hindi till Class VIII. IQAC SRCC is further planning to organize Faculty Development Program on the 'Effective Use of Hindi in different aspects of teaching by the College Faculty' to promote Rajbhasha Annual Program in Government Departments. Further, under the aegis of 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav', on August 4, 2022, a series of programs were commenced by SRCC. Over 10 days, numerous events of various Societies of the College such as Hindi Sahitya Sabha, English Literary Society, Aarohan (Indian Music Society), History and Political Science Society, The Dramatics Society, and Kalakshetra (Dance Society) were organized to celebrate and enrich students and staff about the rich culture and heritage of India. Catharsis, the western music society of SRCC, had the opportunity to brilliantly display its performances on the 5th of August, 2022 by celebrating its event called 'Elixir of Freedom'. The History and Political Science Society also gave Tiranga vibes in the month of Independence by successfully conducting its event eloquence under the aegis of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. The Society celebrated the occasion of Independence through extempore competition namely, 'Eloquence' celebrating 75 years of progressive India and the glorious history of its people, culture and achievements. Aarohan organized an Intra-College singing competition named, 'Aanadotsava', to celebrate the same, the National Service Scheme, SRCC, organized a poster making event for the students of Project Sanskar.

The International Yoga Day is celebrated by the NSS unit of the College annually in collaboration with ATMAN-Society of SRCC. Special lectures, seminars, and workshops are held on the significance of Yoga and its impact on physical, mental, and spiritual wellbeing. These sessions include explication of yoga's benefits as well as practicing certain yoga asanas.

#### **19.**Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

NEP 2020 puts great emphasis on learning outcomes which denote the pre-defined or desired standards of learning expected to be achieved by a student during his/her learning trajectory, making the education system more learner-centric, fair, transparent, and comparable. In other words, learning outcomes are explicit, definite, and measurable knowledge and skills that the learner would gain by pursuing a particular course. As a constituent College of the University of Delhi, the Institution follows the curriculum drafted by the respective Departments of the University and subsequently approved by its Academic Council. The targeted learning outcomes are specified for all the programmes offered by the Institution, which are designed keeping in view the regional and global requirements. The detailed course aims, structure, and syllabi are published on the College website along with its weblinks as provided by the University of Delhi. The same are also incorporated in the College Handbook. Effective communication and reinforcement of Course Outcomes (CO), Programme Outcomes (PO), and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSO) through robust and innovative approaches is of innate importance for the Institution. The College incessantly evaluates the attainment of the same in order to track outcomes and provide timely support as required. To begin with, Faculty Members prepare paper-wise teaching plans to be shared with the Teacher-in-Charge of their respective Departments to ensure that routine teaching activities conform to and achieve the overall targeted outcomes. These plans allow Faculty Members to determine the optimal pedagogy and give students an opportunity to be prepared for classes to absorb and reflect on reading materials shared during lectures in the most useful manner.

The NEP also strongly underlines the need to promote a deep learning approach rather than rote/memory-based learning among students. Since its establishment, SRCC continues to adopt a student-centric teaching-learning approach that encourages students to develop a proper understanding of core concepts, along with practical application of theoretical knowledge in real-life situations. Keeping in view the Outcome-based Education (OBE), Learning Outcome Curriculum Framework (LOCF) has been formulated, with an augmented focus on participative and experiential learning through a more practical orientation, lab work, fieldwork, industrial visits, project works, internships and stronger industry-academia collaborations, in order to cultivate higher-order cognitive skills such as critical thinking, problem-solving, logical reasoning, synthesis, analysis, creativity, and innovation. The Faculty Members of College often make use of novel pedagogical tools and teaching methods such as brainstorming, storytelling, case studies, group discussions, role plays, management games, quizzes, group activities, presentations, and viva-voce, to increase the students' attendance, interest/attention, and the level of participation in classes. The teaching-learning process at SRCC lays special emphasis on the physical, social, emotional, and spiritual needs of students, wherein the Faculty serves as a mentor/facilitator while encouraging open student-teacher interactions, together with the promotion of sports, extracurricular activities, extension and outreach programs for community engagement and environmental welfare, free counselling facility by professional counselors/therapists. All these initiatives and efforts cumulatively lead to improvement in students' self-esteem, self-efficacy, teamwork, social life, decision-making, communication skills, character building, social, moral & environmental consciousness, mental health, overall well-being, and allround/holistic personality development.

#### **20.Distance education/online education:**

SRCC has been proactive in making effective utilization of technological tools in the teaching-learning process even before the Covid-19 induced pandemic hit the economy. The entire SRCC campus is Wi-Fi enabled with multimedia projectors installed in all the classrooms. The College campus has four smart classrooms with digitally interactive panels. In addition, there are virtual labs, a resource centre for the visually challenged, and a state-of-the-Art Media Studio Lab consisting of modern multimedia capabilities, which underscores the institutional preparedness towards the online teaching-learning pedagogy. The College has also been awarded two National Resource Centres in the domains of Economics and Commerce under the scheme of Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. The Centre has successfully re-run the Courses in 2020-2021 comprising forty hours duration under the aegis of Annual Refresher Programme in Teaching (ARPIT), delivered through SWAYAM portal, Ministry of Education, Government of India, over a period of sixteen weeks. The course comprised of e-content, video lectures, discussion forum, and weekly assessment of participants.

Given the restrictions imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic in March 2020, the College was swift enough in switching to an online teaching mode. The College subscribed to the Microsoft Teams platform and the official accounts of all Students and Staff were created by the College to ensure a formal setup for conducting online classes. The College also has an online Student Management System "SmartProf" where the attendance and internal assessment are uploaded by the teachers, allowing real-time access to students. Moreover, the students can also raise their concerns/grievances related to internal assessment through the SmartProf portal, to which the concerned teacher responds within the prescribed time period, thereby ensuring a robust, transparent, and time-effective grievance redressal mechanism. Notably, during the pandemic, the College developed two Smart Classrooms with specialized facilities for blended learning in both online and offline modes. Further, College successfully conducted various events such as Orientation Programme, Seminars, and Conferences, Societies Events in a blended mode in year 2021-22. To mention a few, the IQAC organized an insightful session on 'The Making of Hero: Crisis, Leadership and Beyond' on 8th June, 2021 and was delivered by Guest Speaker, Mr. Sunil Kant Munjal, founder promoters of the Hero Group, India's premier automotive manufacturing group. One week Faculty Research Series was conducted online from July 11th to July 17th, 2022 with an objective of reaching maximum research enthusiasts across all higher education institutes in the country and enable them to learn and enhance their knowledge in the field of research.

With regard to vocational Courses, the College has a dedicated Value-Added Courses Committee which has been efficaciously conducting diverse add-on courses every semester in collaboration with external knowledge partners and experts from the industry to build an effective industry-academia interface. The College conducts add-on courses in all offline, online, and blended modes. The blended mode of learning is encouraged to allow greater accessibility, convenience, and larger participation for the overall benefit of the student community. In view of NEP 2020, the College plans to offer short-term vocational courses on pertinent areas, such as leadership sutras from ancient Indian text, data analytics & machine learning using advanced software such as R, and foreign languages in blended mode, involving a combination of virtual/online lectures and offline face-to-face interactions and field visits. Overall, the College is technologically equipped to embrace the opportunities and to confront the challenges posed by the dynamic and vibrant NEP to positively transform the face of the Indian education system, carving a path for becoming the global leader in the education arena using digital and physical infrastructure.

Second, timetables are prepared with a view to ensure an appropriate teacher-subjectfit and optimized allocation of infrastructure, mainly specialised infrastructure such as Computer Labs for effective delivery of the curriculum. Infrastructure, already modernized, along with academic resources is upgraded continually in anticipation of curriculum needs. Third, coursespecific subject meetings are held, wherein broad contours of curriculum delivery including teaching-learning methods, structure & pace of delivery, integration of contemporary and cross-cutting topics, and internal assessment amongst others are deliberated. Within the broad framework, the faculty members try toinnovate

various aspects of curriculum delivery, including andragogy and assessment methods to maximize theeffectiveness. The democratic and participative teaching-learning environmentin classrooms, strongly supplementedwith highly individualized tutorials vastly enhancesthe learning, knowledge, and abilities of students, ensuring effective curriculum delivery. Curriculum delivery in the College is further strengthened through value-added/add-on courses, lecture series, seminars, and speaker sessions. In addition to concurrent feedback from students during the teachinglearning process, the College also collects feedback from stakeholders on a regular basis and aligns the andragogy with the stakeholders' expectations.

While the College receives academically achieving students due to its admission intake, nonetheless, proactive and conscious efforts are made to create and maintain a harmonious and equitable enabling learning environs that account for different learning levels of students:

- At classroom level, through participation and concurrent feedback, faculty members assess learning levels of students and align their andragogy to maximise their learning. This is further incremented by the personalised interaction at the tutorial level.
- 2. Periodic evaluation helps assess whether students are able to grasp the curriculum delivery. Academically slow learners are identified and continuous two-way interaction with students and feedback on their evaluation helps them accelerate their learning levels.
- 3. Special programmes in form of Remedial Classes, personalised mentoring and extra classes amongst others are held for academically slow learners to further elevate their learning level.

For advanced learners, the College offers an expanding set of opportunities such as value-added courses, industry led courses, publication opportunities and participation in student societies to ensure multiple avenues of knowledge and skill creation and augmentation.

### 2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The extremely learner-oriented philosophy of teaching-learning methodologies at SRCC is to broaden the horizons of students by focusing on multidisciplinary knowledge incorporating value systems and contemporary understanding. skills, and attributes such as critical thinking and creativity.

The College follows a multidimensional andragogical approach to teaching-learning leveraging infrastructure and IT for achievement of effective graduate outcomes. In addition to traditional teaching methods of chalk and talk, and lectures, personalised teaching method is employed through the robust tutorial system promoting student-faculty interactions in small groups on personalised basis. At SRCC, the teaching focuses on two-way vaad, vivaad and samvaad, rather than just one-way communication. ICT based blended teaching methods such as presentations, films, webinars, and software based learning are heavily employed. Participative teaching-learning such as case studies, group discussions and debates amongst others are employed. SRCC also takes lead in innovative teaching methods such as flipped classrooms where students are active brainstromers, learners and researchers. Experiential learning and Engagement based teachinglearning through projects, field and industrial visits, and through the students' expanded role in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are incorporated. Alternate teaching methods such as crossover teaching are also mainstream as faculty

## proactively mentor students in subjects, research and career paths.

SRCC enables an ICT-integrated teaching-learning environment through ICT Infrastructure with free Wi-Fi enabled campus, Wi-Fi enabled projector cum display systems and audio-visual system, virtual labs, Resource Centre for Visually Challenged, and a stateof-the-Art Media Studio Lab having modern multimedia capabilities.

Faculty Members enhance the programme curriculum delivery by employing an ICT driven teaching-learning methodology using methods such as presentations, films, webinars, and software based learning. Students are taught courses such as Accounting through specialised softwares such as Tally Prime. Faculty Members also employ programming languages such as Python and R, and applications such as MS Excel for their courses. Additionally, students are given exposure to working on data through databases such as Prowess IQ subscribed by the College in its Library.

### 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

The College has institutionalised a progressive student-centric open, transparent, equitable and robust Internal Assessment (IA) mechanism, detailed below:

1. The extant University of Delhi guidelines regarding IA are proactively displayed on the College Website, Handbook of Information and Prospectus to ensure information dissemination and awareness. Students are also apprised of the same in classrooms and tutorials.

2. The IA Schedule is planned as per the programme curriculum requirements and the University Academic Calendar. Students are apprised of the modes, frequency and schedule of IA in advance at classroom and tutorial levels by faculty.

3. Instead of a point-of-time single-assessment approach, multiplemethod approach is employed during the semester through regular assignments, presentations and group-discussions amongst other methods to ensure continuous evaluation which helps students develop progressively and provides them with multiple avenues and opportunities of evaluation.

4. Post assessment, faculty discuss the marking and scope of improvement with students. Students are given fair and reasonable opportunities to represent themselves in such discussions. Nonetheless, in cases where grievances arise, students can use the institutionalised IA Grievance Redressal Process, already communicated to them well in advance. The IA marks of students are also displayed on the College website to ensure transparency of information.

1. The IA results are notified at the Classroom and tutorial where faculty discuss the assessment with students. Students are given fair and reasonable opportunities to represent themselves in such discussions.

2. The College notifies the IA Grievance Redressal Mechanism timely through the College Website and SmartProf Student Management System. # INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

# **4.1 - Physical Facilities**

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Over the years, SRCC has consistently improved its infrastructure in anticipation of stakeholder's requirements and expectations, within the regulatory constraints imposed by its heritage building status and classification as an 'Old College,' rather than a 'General College'. SRCC's Teaching Learning and Research Infrastructure comprises both physical and digital mediums, to facilitate effective the multi-dimensional teaching-learning employed in the College. The classrooms are centrally airconditioned classrooms having vintage teak furniture and facilities such as three panel green boards, podiums, overhead Wi-Fi, and VGA enabled LCD projectors. The G.B.O programme has classrooms with bass-boosted audio-visual system and smart podiums. There are two smart classrooms equipped with lecture recording systems. The Research and Tutorial block has fifty-four air-conditioned, Wi-Fi-enabled rooms with green boards and seating for approximately fifteen students. The Research and Tutorial Block also has important offices such as Placement Cell and the Counselling Service. The College has three computer labs equipped with the latest hardware and software. The automated College Library is a three-storey, centrally air-conditioned, Wi-Fienabled structure that seats about 300 people. With over 80,000 books in its collection, the library offers an Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), electronic resources via the DULS, and remote access to e-publications via DELNET. The College Library also houses the Resource centre for Visually Challenged equipped with enabling technology to empowers differently-abled students.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

To ensure quality avenues of co-curricular and extra-curricular development, and engagement with industry and community, the College has state-of-the-art cultural and sports infrastructure. The College has amongst the best-in-class renovated and modernized Auditorium, called, "Shridhar Shriram Auditorium", with in-built hi-tech sound and lighting systems, congenial acoustic systems, live streaming, Wi-Fi enabled presentation facility, automated projection, partition and modern Green Rooms.

For hosting important co-curricular and extra-curricular events such as guest lectures, group discussion, international programmes, speaker sessions, seminars and symposia amongst others, the College has an air-conditioned ICT-enabled Seminar Room.

The SRCC Sports Complex comprises a multipurpose Indoor Sports Stadium of international standards with a seating capacity of about 1200 spectators, and an outdoor sports field. The Sports Stadium has a multipurpose sports hall with wooden planks for Badminton, Basket Ball, Volley Ball, Judo and Wrestling. There are separate rooms for chess and table tennis. SRCC is the also one of the few colleges in the University of Delhi to have a swimming pool facility.

The Sports Complex also houses the College's fitness center/gymnasium. The Center also holds classes for kickboxing, yoga and aerobics. The College has several lawns adorned with large number of diverse trees and flowers, where in addition to yoga, cultural activities are held.

It has a computerized catalogue i.e., Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), internet facility and online search services (Intra-net) for its users. It follows the Dewey Decimal System of classification, 23rd edition and books are processed by using AACR-II code that aims to provide a hassle-free experience of locating the academic resources. Faculty Members have remote access to e-publications through DELNET, Prowess database and Economic outlook. The College has a unique Resource Centre for visually-impaired students, developed under the SRCC Enabling Unit. A dedicated internet service area, known as "Library Resource Centre," is installed with computers and a Wi-Fi-enabled projector to facilitate access to academic resources. The library has an Archival unit and its mission is to promote exchange of information like records, manuscripts, photographs, video graphs, etc. of archival importance to the College. Ancillary services such as wheelchair, ramp and alarm facility for differently-abled students and mobile charging kiosks are available in library premises for users' convenience.

The College has established systems and procedures towards maintaining and utilising its infrastructure, in adherence to extant rules and regulations and keeping in view its own ethos of governance. The Timetable Committee ensures the optimal use of academic and support infrastructure. Suitable recommendations are regularly made for the further expansion of the existing space, including remodeling of the existing space. Annual maintenance contracts are in place for the upkeep of its hardware and software systems. A Sports Committee has been constituted for the maintenance of physical infrastructural facilities pertaining to the Sports Complex. The College has appointed a Senior Technical Assistant and a Computer Network Assistant to assist in computerrelated support services. Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMCs) are signed with external agencies for the maintenance of Computers, LANs and other hardware equipments. A full-time Caretaker has been appointed to ensure cleanliness, hygiene, and a smooth water supply, electricity, and security in the campus. The College has its own full-time staff such as plumber, electrician, sweepers, and gardeners to ensure the regular maintenance of the infrastructure.

To achieve its vision and mission, SRCC has a forward looking and carefully etched Strategic Plan defining its goals, objectives and focus areas. The Strategic Plan focuses on faculty, placements, academics, infrastructure, research, GBO Program and alumni in a phased manner. The implementation of the Strategic Plan is visible in the institutional progress and outcomes of the College, both academic and non-academic. SRCC introduced a number of value-added courses offered by reputed organisations such as Coursera to improve the curriculum profile. To improve student well-being, counselling services have been deepened in the College. Economically marginalized and meritorious students are being offered a greater number of scholarships and financial aid. Additional investment is being made in the IT infrastructure of the College such as more Computer Labs for better learningoutcomes and digital empowerment of the students. # **6.3 - Faculty Empowerment Strategies**

# 6.5 - Internal Quality Assurance System

The IQAC, SRCC proactively enhances the quality of higher education, specially academics and administration in the College. This is done through formation and implementation of stakeholder oriented quality assurance standards, strategies and processes. For instance, the IQAC sets procedures and review mechanism towards hiring of faculty for the PGDGBO programme.

To improve administrative and academic functioning, the IQAC recommended digitalisation through introduction of Smartprof system. The IQAC also recommended the enhancement of infrastructure in anticipation of increasing stakeholder's requirements. The IQAC reviewed the Green initiatives of the College towards environment and undertook the process of Green Audit. In addition to several policy frameworks and processes, the IQAC also organised several events and activities. To promote research, the IQAC recommended the expansion of the College's "Centre for Academic Excellence" Scheme in terms of scope and reimbursement of expenses. The IQAC SRCC organised several events to build a research-focused environment, a few of which are listed below:

- 1. 10-Day Faculty Research Series from July 11 to July 20, 2022
- 2. Session on "Research Paper Writing" on September 30, 2021
- 3. A Two-Day International Conference on "Growing Synergies between Finance and Technology" on March 11 and 12, 2022

It also resolved to implement a robust feedback driven process wherein a Faculty would be continued for the forthcoming Semester based upon strong student feedback.
- Further, to promote research, the IQAC recommended the expansion of "Centre for Academic Excellence" scheme of SRCC in terms of scope and reimbursement of expenses.

SRCC has implemented a comprehensive waste management system ensuring effective waste management of both biodegradable and nonbiodegradable waste. First, there is segregating bio and nonbiodegradable waste at source for which bins are placed at different locations in the College. Second, the College has an inhouse Sanitisation Park with NADEP composting pits to generate compost ready for use in its gardens. Leaf Shredding is done as per the capacity of the composting pits and sufficient compost is generated for college gardens. Additional compost so prepared is branded and sold in collaboration with the Centre for Green Initiatives, SRCC. For paper waste generated in the campus,the College has an MoU with 'Greenobin Recycling Private Limited' wherein the paper waste is converted into usable products such as notebooks and other products for subsequent use.

Liquid waste generated by RO Plants is used in the Washrooms. The AC Condensate waste is also recharged to earth. Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste is not generated in the College.The College also manages its E-Waste as per extant guidelines.

In addition to concurrent feedback from students during the teaching-learning process, the College also collects feedback from stakeholders on a regular basis and aligns the andragogy with the stakeholders' expectations.

- At classroom level, through participation and concurrent feedback, faculty members assess learning levels of students and align their andragogy to maximise their learning. This is further incremented by the personalised interaction at the tutorial level.
- 2. Periodic evaluation helps assess whether students are able to grasp the curriculum delivery. Academically slow learners are identified and continuous two-way interaction with students and feedback on their evaluation helps them accelerate their learning levels.
- 3. Special programmes in form of Remedial Classes, personalised mentoring and extra classes amongst others are held for academically slow learners to further elevate their learning level.

For advanced learners, the College offers an expanding set of opportunities such as value-added courses, industry led courses, publication opportunities and participation in student societies to ensure multiple avenues of knowledge and skill creation and augmentation.

Faculty Members enhance the programme curriculum delivery by employing an ICT driven teaching-learning methodology using methods such as presentations, films, webinars, and software based learning. Students are taught courses such as Accounting through specialised softwares such as Tally Prime. Faculty Members also employ programming languages such as Python and R, and applications such as MS Excel for their courses. #### **2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms**

The College has institutionalised a progressive student-centric open, transparent, equitable and robust Internal Assessment (IA) mechanism, detailed below:

1. The extant University of Delhi guidelines regarding IA are proactively displayed on the College Website, Handbook of Information and Prospectus to ensure information dissemination and awareness. Students are also apprised of the same in classrooms and tutorials.

2. The IA Schedule is planned as per the programme curriculum requirements and the University Academic Calendar. Students are apprised of the modes, frequency and schedule of IA in advance at classroom and tutorial levels by faculty.

3. Instead of a point-of-time single-assessment approach, multiple-method approach is employed during the semester through regular assignments, presentations and groupdiscussions amongst other methods to ensure continuous evaluation which helps students develop progressively and provides them with multiple avenues and opportunities of evaluation.

4. Post assessment, faculty discuss the marking and scope of improvement with students. Students are given fair and reasonable opportunities to represent themselves in such discussions. Nonetheless, in cases where grievances arise, students can use the institutionalised IA Grievance Redressal Process, already communicated to them well in advance. The IA marks of students are also displayed on the College website to ensure transparency of information.

The College has a multi-stage institutionalised and wellcommunicated mechanism for internal assessment (IA) related grievances:

1. The IA results are notified at the Classroom and tutorial where faculty discuss the assessment with students. Students are given fair and reasonable opportunities to represent themselves in such discussions.

2. The College notifies the IA Grievance Redressal Mechanism timely through the College Website and SmartProf Student Management System. Students are provided with reasonable time to register their IA issues on the SmartProf system. Grievances registered are promptly notified to the concerned faculty.

A time-bound process is adopted wherein faculty member have to resolve IA grievance(s) pertaining to their course on the SmartProf portal. Students are notified of the decision of the faculty towards the IA grievance.

At the next level, there are College-level Committees such as the Internal Assessment Monitoring Committee and the Internal Assessment Grievance Committee, for resolution of IA grievances already resolved at individual faculty level, which take appropriate steps to examine and resolve such issues.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

#### 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Over the years, SRCC has consistently improved its infrastructure in anticipation of stakeholder's requirements and expectations, within the regulatory constraints imposed by its heritage building status and classification as an 'Old College, ' rather than a 'General College'. SRCC's Teaching Learning and Research Infrastructure comprises both physical and digital mediums, to facilitate effective the multidimensional teaching-learning employed in the College. The classrooms are centrally air-conditioned classrooms having vintage teak furniture and facilities such as three panel green boards, podiums, overhead Wi-Fi, and VGA enabled LCD projectors. The G.B.O programme has classrooms with bassboosted audio-visual system and smart podiums. There are two smart classrooms equipped with lecture recording systems. The Research and Tutorial block has fifty-four air-conditioned, Wi-Fi-enabled rooms with green boards and seating for approximately fifteen students. The Research and Tutorial Block also has important offices such as Placement Cell and the Counselling Service. The College has three computer labs equipped with the latest hardware and software. The automated College Library is a three-storey, centrally air-conditioned, Wi-Fi-enabled structure that seats about 300 people. With over 80,000 books in its collection, the library offers an Online

Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), electronic resources via the DULS, and remote access to e-publications via DELNET. The College Library also houses the Resource centre for Visually Challenged equipped with enabling technology to empowers differently-abled students.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

To ensure quality avenues of co-curricular and extra-curricular development, and engagement with industry and community, the College has state-of-the-art cultural and sports infrastructure. The College has amongst the best-in-class renovated and modernized Auditorium, called, "Shridhar Shriram Auditorium", with in-built hi-tech sound and lighting systems, congenial acoustic systems, live streaming, Wi-Fi enabled presentation facility, automated projection, partition and modern Green Rooms.

For hosting important co-curricular and extra-curricular events such as guest lectures, group discussion, international programmes, speaker sessions, seminars and symposia amongst others, the College has an air-conditioned ICT-enabled Seminar Room.

The SRCC Sports Complex comprises a multipurpose Indoor Sports Stadium of international standards with a seating capacity of about 1200 spectators, and an outdoor sports field. The Sports Stadium has a multipurpose sports hall with wooden planks for Badminton, Basket Ball, Volley Ball, Judo and Wrestling. There are separate rooms for chess and table tennis. SRCC is the also one of the few colleges in the University of Delhi to have a swimming pool facility.

The Sports Complex also houses the College's fitness center/gymnasium. The Center also holds classes for kickboxing, yoga and aerobics. The College has several lawns adorned with large number of diverse trees and flowers, where in addition to

The College Library is well-equipped with the modern and sophisticated digital systems such as fully automated RFID technology and database management software LibSys 7 (EJB) Rel 1.0 version. It has a computerized catalogue i.e., Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), internet facility and online search services (Intra-net) for its users. It follows the Dewey Decimal System of classification, 23rd edition and books are processed by using AACR-II code that aims to provide a hasslefree experience of locating the academic resources. Faculty Members have remote access to e-publications through DELNET, Prowess database and Economic outlook. The College has a unique Resource Centre for visually-impaired students, developed under the SRCC Enabling Unit. A dedicated internet service area, known as "Library Resource Centre," is installed with computers and a Wi-Fi-enabled projector to facilitate access to academic resources. The library has an Archival unit and its mission is to promote exchange of information like records, manuscripts, photographs, video graphs, etc. of archival importance to the College. Ancillary services such as wheelchair, ramp and alarm facility for differently-abled students and mobile charging kiosks are available in library premises for users' convenience.

The College has established systems and procedures towards maintaining and utilising its infrastructure, in adherence to extant rules and regulations and keeping in view its own ethos of governance. The Timetable Committee ensures the optimal use of academic and support infrastructure. Suitable recommendations are regularly made for the further expansion of the existing space, including remodeling of the existing space. Annual maintenance contracts are in place for the upkeep of its hardware and software systems. A Sports Committee has been constituted for the maintenance of physical infrastructural facilities pertaining to the Sports Complex. The College has appointed a Senior Technical Assistant and a Computer Network Assistant to assist in computer-related support services. Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMCs) are signed with external agencies for the maintenance of Computers, LANs and other hardware equipments. A full-time Caretaker has been appointed to ensure cleanliness, hygiene, and a smooth water supply, electricity, and security in the campus. The College has its own full-time staff such as plumber, electrician, sweepers, and gardeners to ensure the regular maintenance of the infrastructure.

## **6.3 - Faculty Empowerment Strategies**

6.3.1 - The institution has effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff

Being a conscientious institution, SRCC progressively undertakes several welfare measures for its teaching and nonteaching staff. SRCC has a unique Centre for Academic Excellence scheme offering financial assistance to teaching and non-teaching staff, as well as, students to undertake research and participate in conferences/workshops/seminars/development programmes. While the primary source of funding remains Grants by the University Grants Commission and Trust Contribution, SRCC actively mobilises funds towards achievement of its vision and in the interest of its stakeholders.

First, the College augments its funds by undertaking Research, Training and Consultancy with reputed organisations such as the RBI Academy and the ICLS Academy amongst others. ## 6.5 - Internal Quality Assurance System

6.5.1 - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes

The IQAC, SRCC proactively enhances the quality of higher education, specially academics and administration in the College. This is done through formation and implementation of stakeholder oriented quality assurance standards, strategies and processes. For instance, the IQAC sets procedures and review mechanism towards hiring of faculty for the PGDGBO programme.

To improve administrative and academic functioning, the IQAC recommended digitalisation through introduction of Smartprof system. The IQAC reviewed the Green initiatives of the College towards environment and undertook the process of Green

Audit. In addition to several policy frameworks and processes, the IQAC also organised several events and activities. To promote research, the IQAC recommended the expansion of the College's "Centre for Academic Excellence" Scheme in terms of scope and reimbursement of expenses. The IQAC SRCC organised several events to build a research-focused environment, a few of which are listed below:

- 1. 10-Day Faculty Research Series from July 11 to July 20, 2022
- 2. Session on "Research Paper Writing" on September 30, 2021
- 3. A Two-Day International Conference on "Growing Synergies between Finance and Technology" on March 11 and 12, 2022

SRCC promotes gender equity through several proactive initiatives, few of which are listed below:

- Constitution of dedicated units such as Women Development Cell which undertake specific gender empowerment initiatives.
- Formulation and implementation of Annual Gender Sensitization Action Plan.
- Awareness of Gender specific Issues, and Gender Sensitization through Speakers Sessions, Seminars, and lectures etc.
- At the society level, undertaking social projects through student societies of Connecting Dream Foundation (CDF), and National Service Scheme and the ENACTUS SRCC aimed at empowering women and promoting gender equity. For example, 'AROGAYA', a project of CDF SRCC makes menstrual hygiene affordable and accessible to rural areas along with urban slums through cost effective sanitary pads, in addition to creating women entrepreneurs. Similarly, during the COVID-19 pandemic, ENACTUS SRCC through its social entrepreneurship project 'Aavran' generated employment opportunities for povertystricken women by providing them training, resources and market access to manufacture Khadi and Cotton face-masks.
- Proactive spread of awareness and information of statutory provisions such as POSH Act and Internal Complaints Committee, including its procedures, through avenues such as the Handbook and Website of the College.
- Several feedback and complaint boxes are mounted in the Campus to ensure multiple avenues of registering grievances, if any.

SRCC has implemented a comprehensive waste management system ensuring effective waste management of both biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste. First, there is segregating bio and non-biodegradable waste at source for which bins are placed at different locations in the College. Second, the College has an inhouse Sanitisation Park with NADEP composting pits to generate compost ready for use in its gardens. Leaf Shredding is done as per the capacity of the composting pits and sufficient compost is generated for college gardens. Additional compost so prepared is branded and sold in collaboration with the Centre for Green Initiatives, SRCC. For paper waste generated in the campus, the College has an MoU with 'Greenobin Recycling Private Limited' wherein the paper waste is converted into usable products such as notebooks and other products for subsequent use.

Liquid waste generated by RO Plants is used in the Washrooms. The AC Condensate waste is also recharged to earth. Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste is not generated in the College.The College also manages its E-Waste as per extant guidelines.
