Outgoing Programmes 2018

1. INDO Dutch Collaborative Programme (3rd June – 9th June 2018)

Theme : Strategic Management and Cultural Context

The IndoDutch Collaborative Programme involving students from Shri Ram College of Commerce, Miranda House and Utrecht Business School was held at HU Business School School, University of Applied Sciences, Utrecht, Netherlands from the 4th of June to the 8th of June, 2018.

The intensive international encounter commenced with our course director, Jelly Offereins and mentor, Gerard van Leeuwen briefing us about the sessions. This was followed by an interesting ice breaking session to familiarise the Indian and Dutch students with each other. The programme involved a corporate simulation game based on the theme 'Doing Business in Emerging Markets'. The group was divided into teams of 4 comprising participants from all the 3 colleges. The game involved quick decision making based on hypothetical situations faced by a smartphone company in the domains of finance, marketing, operations and HR.

We also took a day off from the curriculum to visit the ship museum at Batavia where we saw various artefacts and a short film about the geographical history of The Netherlands. The film focused land reclamation processes and elaborate drainage systems(lakes and canals) harnessed by the Dutch in their country. In addition we witnessed a magnificent life size retired ship.

On the last day of the programme, the Indian students dressed in traditional attire received their certificates of completion. The programme was indeed an enriching experience as it enhanced the cultural awareness of students from both the countries.



2. INDO Bhutan Collaborative Programme (25th October – 28th October 2018)

Bhutan India relations existed long before the establishment of diplomatic relations when spring water from mountains of Bhutan fed the fertile plains of India, while the spiritual nourishment from the plains of India enriched the valleys of Bhutan. The year '2018' is a milestone moment for IndiaBhutan partnership as the two nations celebrate the accomplishments of the last five decades of the timetested and special ties.

As India and Bhutan celebrate their 50 years of friendship, the various institutions and departments of the two nations came together to make it more memorable and a cherished moment. Shri Ram College of Commerce's Office of International Programmes (OIP), Royal University of Bhutan's Gedu College of Business Studies (GCBS), Indian Embassy (Thimphu), Ministry of Education, Ministry of Agriculture and Forests and Nehru Wangchuk Cultural Centre (NWCC) contributed towards strengthening of educational, environmental and cultural ties between the two nations. Briefly, it included signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Shri Ram College of Commerce and Gedu College of Business Studies along with participation by the students of SRCC in their GFest and lecture sessions by the SRCC faculty members. It was followed by various sessions/meetings at the Indian Embassy, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Agriculture and Forests and NWCC at Thimphu in Bhutan. It concluded with a proposal of students and youth from Bhutan visiting Shri Ram College of Commerce, University of Delhi in India during February, 2019.

The various programs undertaken can be listed as follows:

a) Indo Bhutan International Program, GFest 2018, GEDU

The IndoBhutan International Exchange Program was organized from 25th to 28th October, 2018 at the Gedu College of Business Studies at Gedu in Bhutan. The college organized GFest, a Business Literary Fest on 'Promoting Creative, Innovative and Decisive Thinking amongst Students'. The event began with a warm welcome by the student organizers of the GFest at the guest house followed by the lunch comprising of their national delicacies. Post lunch began the GFest, 2018 with a Business Plan Competition scheduled at 2:30 p.m. where students of SRCC and from the various colleges of Bhutan presented their business models capturing the creative and innovative ideas of youth of today.



In total, eight colleges of Bhutan and one from India participated and amazed and attracted the attention of the judges and the audience with their business plans. Each team was given ten minutes for presentation followed by a round of interjections. A healthy competitive spirit among the participants lit up the atmosphere. Team India was represented by Saket Subh and Pragati Soni. They presented Project 'Arpan' on smokeless incense sticks. The plan being innovative and less capital intensive was well discussed and highly deliberated upon and secured first prize.

In the evening, another event 'Fluctuate' was organized. Fluctuate, popularly Known as turncoat was a platform where the participants were expected to be on their toes. Unlike debating, this literary sport calls for your stance with two perspectives. The participant is expected to change his/her stance as the judges push the buzzer. Exciting as it was, the icing on the cake is the ticking timer that hangs like a sword over the participant's head. Aastha George, representative India, Shri Ram College Of Commerce, University Of Delhi won the runners up position in the event.

Day 2 of the GFest began with Quest of Games, a treasure hunt competition. Gunjan Bansal and Seerat Kaur represented the college in this event. The event had 2 levels. The first level comprised of a question related to business word to be answered, following which students were given clue to find the treasure, which was a flag of a country. Successfully clearing this level, the students reached level 2 wherein there was a round of Dumb charades, followed by another question related to business. The students of SRCC secured the 1st position in the event. The Quest was basically on the idea of business and to enrich knowledge among the students to put in their talent to solve the business problems in a short span of time. The treasure hunt was followed by two competitions, Brand Race and Rural Le Carte, where students showcased their knowledge & marketing skills. In Brand Race, participants were supposed to make an advertisement video of maximum 3 minutes. Mohit Shroff and Vandana Sambharia represented the college in this event. The judgement was made on the basis of creativity, video editing and presentation. Our college could not win, but it was a great learning experience. Muskaan Karwani and Anshul Kanojia participated in Rural Le Carte. Round 1 of the event required the participants to bid on items, which were traditional Bhutanese handicraft items, and collect the most appropriate item in accordance to case study given. Our team successfully bid on 4 items, which was the maximum number secured by any contestant. The second round required the teams to select one item of all the items they won in the bidding round and prepare an elaborate marketing plan for the same. Our team selected the traditional Bhutanese butter lamp as our product offering. Our marketing plan consisted of detailed information about our plan to increase sales and improve visibility of the product in the international markets. The team secured the 3rd position out of 9 participating colleges. Also, the SRCC faculty members accompanying the students interacted with the students of Gedu College and apprised them on various contemporary and social issues. A cultural programme was also organized in the evening where the students and faculty of various colleges presented their culture through music and dance. Day 3 began with a session of ExChief Justice of Bhutan on the conversion of Bhutan from a monarch to a democratic nation and the process of establishment of constitution and laws.

It was followed by a lecture of Dr. Sonam Choiden, President, Gedu College of Business Studies on Macroeconomics of Gross National Happiness (GNI). Afternoon session witnessed award ceremony where students of Shri Ram College of Commerce were able to secure first and other positions in four of the five competitions along with cash prizes. The event came to an end with bonfire to mark the successful completion of G Fest, 2018.

8). SRCC-University of Birmingham Indo UK Collaborative Programme (17th November 2017)

Theme : "Contemporary Issues In The Global Supply Chain"

Prof. Mc Garric, Senior Lecturer, Director Birmingham Business School was invited to share his views on the topic "Contemporary Issues In The Global Supply Chain". The session was an extremely enriching one, which helped the participants to not only understand the domestic supply chain but also informed them of the scenario internationally. 10). SRCC-Hong Kong University (HKU) Indo Hong Kong Meet (9th November 2017)

Theme : "UN HeForSHe Initiative and Gender Equity"

A lecture session on the theme "UN HeForSHe Initiative and Gender Equity" was delivered by guest speaker professor Peter Mathieson, president, HKU. The session provided the students with detailed insights into the UN HeForShe Initiative and the rapid progress it has made in various parts of the world and its tie ups with several notable academic Institutions in all the continents. The speaker also highlighted how HKU is fostering gender equity by enabling participation and empowering female faculty members both at the junior and senior levels and incorporating a special gender sensitisation course in the curriculum. Prof. Simrit Kaur, Principal SRCC shared her insights about Gender equity in India as well as abroad. This was followed by a dicsussion orchestrated by Professor Numala Rao, Faculty of Education, HKU. There was a test at the end of the programme for the participants on the theme of the lecture session.

Theme : Business economics and Tourism

There was a lecture session on 'Latest Research in Business, Economics, Hospitality, Tourism How the students are involved' for 45 SRCC participants. This was followed by a test The speakers were Prof. Carolene Scarles, Head of School of Hospitality, Prof. Neil Rickman, Prof of Eco, Director of Research, Prof. Stevewood, Prof. of Retail Marketing Management & Prof. Marco Mongcello Associate Dean, International Executive Director of P.G Programme.

14). SRCC-Melbourne Business School Indo Australian Initiative (4th Septmber 2017)

Theme : India and Australia Need for New generation of Entrepreneurs

The programme started with a welcome by Prof Simrit Kaur, Principal, SRCC. There was a special lecture on "Characteristics of Successful Entrepreneur in India" by Prof Colin McLeod, Prof.of Management & Marketing at University of Melbourne. The other guests are :Mr Stephen Clowry, Global Engagement Coordinator ,Faculty of Business &Economics,(FBE),Univ.of Melbourne. Mr. Chris Parker, Director(FBE)Ms.Tessa Shaw, Coordinator, Marketing & Communications(FBE)Presentation and discussion centring challenges to be addressed by entrepreneurs, risks & avenues, opportunities and scope in India and Australia, incubation centres and case studies of some successful global and Indian startups infused an entrepreneurial spirit among the students. The session concluded with a brainstorming activity that taught the participants, who were ready to venture some innovative ideas, about what shapes the spirit of young entrepreneurs: passion, positivity, ambition and leadership.

15). SRCC-University of Wolverhampton Indo UK Collaborative Programme (8th Septmber – 10th Septmber 2017)

Theme : Empowerment through Education'

A three days exchange programme was organised in SRCC from 08th to 10th September 2017 on the theme 'Empowerment through Education'. The participants included 12 female students from University of Wolverhampton, who were accompanied by Dr.Ranjit Khutan, Head of Public Health, and 24 students from SRCC. After an opening address by Prof. Simrit Kaur and Dr. RP Rustagi on the importance of education, empowerment and cross cultural understanding, the students were engaged in fun filled ice breaking activities like Pictionary & got a chance to know each other well. Dr. Ranjit Khutan gave a lecture on the importance of public health and the courses available at the University of Wolverhampton. A session on

writing the Statement of Purpose was conducted. A panel consisting of students from both the institutions was formed to discuss on 'Women Empowerment though Education' and the students understood the intensity, similarities and differences of this social cause across the continents.

16). SRCC-Australian National University (ANU) Indo Australian Initiative (4th Septmber 2017)

Theme : 'International Business: Issues in Global Economy'

Prof Simrit Kaur started with a welcome to the Faculties from ANU and an address to the participants about the aspects & challenges of International Business in the contemporary world. The aim of this initiative was to prepare our students to become the next generation of global business leaders, embracing the opportunities and challenges of international business. There were lectures on "Political risk and issues of doing business in a foreign country" by Prof. Andrew Bradley, Dean of the Faculty & Director of Education, ANU and on "Introduction to Actuarial Science" by Prof Gaurav Khemka, Senior Faculty, ANU. The session also acquainted the participants on the career prospects of various professional courses at ANU. Mind boggling oral quiz and written test was conducted at the end of the programme and best performers were awarded certificates of commendation.

17). SRCC-Penn State Indo-US Collaborative Programme (7th July – 17th July 2017)

The SRCC Penn State Indo US Collaborative Study Programme was held from 7th 17th July, 2017. The first day of the programme began with an inauguration where the incoming delegates were welcomed and oriented, followed by formation of buddy groups and a university tour in the evening. Some of the notable events of the other days were – a) visit to Rashtrapati Bhawan, India Gate, Gandhi Bhawan, and Akshardham temple, b) Industrial and Business visit, c) Village survey, d) pottery workshop, panel discussion, quiz, sports etc. On the last day of the programme i.e 17th July, the students presented their respective projects and in the evening the programme came to an end with a beautiful cultural event.

18). SRCC-MH-UBS Indo-Dutch Collaborative Programme (26th June – 1st July 2017)

Theme : "International Strategic Management and Cultural Context"

The Indo Dutch collaborative program took place between Shri Ram College of Commerce and Utrecht Business School in Netherlands from 26th to 30th June, 2017. A team of 17 students and Professor Vikas Madan from SRCC took part in the exchange program. The students were introduced to a program called "LINKS", a hightech software to train students in strategic management. A virtual company was run for 8 guarters by taking key managerial decisions. Each team had 5 members out of which 2 were of European students Analysis of previous quarter reports and market research was conducted to take decisions regarding product forecasting, promotion services which required the students to think rationally and analytically. The team with the maximum rate of return, market share and best forecast were declared the winners on the last day. Students got the opportunity to work with people from different cultures and backgrounds. The discussions with the foreign participants led to insightful discussions which made us appreciate each other's diverse viewpoints and perspective. Indian students gave a presentation on the topic "Indian culture and business". This gave European students an insight of Indian traditions and beliefs, business culture and business opportunities along with a glimpse of the strength of the Indian economy. There was an informative and insightful presentation on by Professor Vikas Madan from SRCC on cognitive science and the untapped marketing potential of businesses. It focussed on developing more interactive products and marketing campaign to provide personalised experience to each individual separately according to his needs and preferences. The students also went to Amsterdam, the Hague and learnt more about the art of the city and enjoyed its local colours.

19). SRCC-Ministry of Youth and Affairs (MoY) Exchange Programmes (29th January - 2nd February 2018) Portugal

The Indian Youth Delegation visited Portugal from 29 January 2018 to 2 February 2018. The delegation consisted of 8 youth participants from diverse backgrounds and two officials. On their arrival in Lisbon the participants were greeted by Mr. Jorge Orlando Queiros, Director in Department of Information, Communication and International Relations of Instituto Portugues do Desporto e Juventude (IPDJ). On the first day, there was a visit to the headquarters of IPDJ and meeting with the President of the Governing Board of IPDJ – Mr. Augusto Baganha. Post the working meetings, they went to see Praca do Comercio, Time Out Complex and Campo Pequeno. The next day, there was a visit to START.SOCIAL – an NGO aimed at community development in the underprivileged neighbourhood of Quinta do Mocho. Cascais, has been declared as the European Youth Capital 2018, and thus, a visit to this city was a must. The participants visited the Jamor Sports Centre and Startup Lisboa – an incubation centre for startups. On the last day, the SRCC students were invited by the Indian Embassy in Lisbon. the residence of the Indian Ambassador – Mrs. K. Nandini Singla and discussed with her the highlights of our trip, the relations between India and Portugal, and how they can be further strengthened. To conclude the programme, we went to meet the Chief of Staff of Secretary of State – Youth and Sports Office and discussed about the future of such delegations. Being a part of this delegation was a very rich experience for all participants .

20). Brics Youth Summit (24th July – 28th July 2017)

The BRICS Youth Summit 2017, held in Beijing, China, from 24th-28th July, was a conglomeration of youth leaders from all across the world to ideate on global challenges faced by youth in terms of inclusion and diversity, representation and parity. The first day of the arrival on 25th July, comprised of icebreaking sessions amongst different contingents. On 26th July, all of the delegations gathered in the Meixuan Conference Hall, for the Summit Photograph, followed by presentations of various delegations on Youth in Policy, Innovation, and Global Governance, accompanied by instances of the same being followed in respective countries. The day also continued into visits to OFO Bicycle Office, Tiananmen Square and Forbidden City, and a cultural workshop on ancient Chinese Handicrafts and scriptures. On 27th the delegations was taken to the Olympic Park and the Great Wall. In the evening, deliberations were continued on the passing of the final achievement paper, and that was followed by the Great Banquet and Cultural ceremony that was marked by performances by members of each delegation. Members from our delegation performed Hindustani semiclassical music and dance. The three day sojourn ended on 28th, when all delegations bid each other adieu, with poignant memories of the Summit, and lessons to cherish for lifetime.

21). Indian Youth Delegation to China (9th June 16th June 2017)

Shri Vijay Goel, Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports and He Junke, President, ACYF inaugurated the Welcome Banquet by "All China Youth Federation" arranged for all the delegates from SRCC on the first day. Two IFS officers also accompanied throughout the journey to the magnificent Great Wall of China.

In the afternoon there was a ceremony in The Indian Embassy followed by a visit to the Youth Centre for Cultural Experience activities Tai Chi and Calligraphy. In the evening the participants proceeded to Hefei by air. There was a visit to Binhu Wetland Forest Park. which is an excellent example of Hefei's afforestation efforts. The SUNWIN and iFYTEK, University of Science and Technology of China ,A community care center on day 6 and the Tongji University on day 7 were visited. ZJ Innopark, Venture Studio and Alibaba Group Innovation Center on the next day marked the end of the program.
