Message from the Vice Chancellor



Dear Students and Colleagues,

Humanity is facing an unprecedented challenge of our time. Due to COVID-19 pandemic, millions of people worldwide have to endure trauma, both physical and psychological. This crisis has affected almost every aspect of life; the teaching-learning process is no exception.

Indeed, we are all missing our lively and interactive classrooms and laboratories, but something must be done to ensure continuity and creativity in our academic journey. To address the present situation, the University of Delhi has intensified its efforts to reorient its outreach mostly through virtual engagement with its students. All teachers have been encouraged to share reading materials, class notes, etc. with their students through email or WhatsApp and host lectures by using Google Class Room or other video-conferencing platforms. Off-campus access to library resources has been extended to all faculty and students. Moreover, the hostel and health Centre administration is on alert and ready to help those who reside in the campus. A DU Task Force meets regularly online to discuss problems and solutions concerning COVID-19. We are vigilant and respond to the calls of the government to deal with the situation.
