Advice

- Utmost care must be exercised in submitting Personal details, Social Category, Caste and Gender. Once submitted, these cannot be changed.
- Utmost care should be taken while filling Class XII marks as these will be the basis of breaking the merit tie, if any.
- Ensure all relevant documents are valid and in the prescribed format.
- UoD will not entertain any undertaking in lieu of incomplete/non-availability of certificates/documents.
- Fill the form well before the deadline and do not be in haste while filling the form.

Submission

The order of preferences must be ensured as per choice. Editing of the Program + College combination will NOT be allowed.

Advice for Giving Program + College Preferences

- Select as many Programs as possible, subject to fulfilling the eligibility criteria.
- Fill maximum number of preferences.
- Arrange the preference order of Program + College very carefully.
- Addition/Deletion of Preferences will not be allowed at a later stage.
- Only the Programs + College Combinations selected by the candidate during the Preference-Filling phase will be considered for allocation and upgradations.
- Start shortlisting the Programs and Colleges they are interested in to avoid lastminute haste.
- Read UG Bulletin of Information thoroughly and then confirm your preferences of Program + College, before the deadline of the Preference-Filling phase.
- Do not wait for the last date of Preference filling.

- On the closure of the Preference-filling phase, the University will also announce **SIMULATED RANKS** based on the data available at that time. The candidates will again get an opportunity to add/delete/reorder their preferences. Henceforth, the addition/deletion of preferences will not be allowed.
- The Highest Possible Preference will be provisionally allocated to a candidate considering
- Program-Specific merit a)
- b) Category (UR/OBC-NCL/ SC/ ST/ EWS/ Minority
- Availability of seats **C**)



Allocation - Admission



Important: In order to be considered for upgradation in the subsequent rounds a candidate <u>must "Accept"</u> the allocated seat.



Acceptance of the provisionally allocated seat

Non-Acceptance of the allocated seat-

- No action/ inactivity will be taken as non-acceptance to the Allocated Seat will be treated as a decline to the provisional offer of an Allocated Seat.
- Candidate will no longer be able to participate in the subsequent rounds of CSAS-2023

Online Approval by the College



The College will check the eligibility and verify documents of the candidate.

- College shall "Approve" or "Reject".
- If approved, Pay the "Admission Fee" and confirm the admission on the allocated seat.

Upgrade And Freeze Options



- Admitted candidate may choose ' Upgrade' option to try for their higher submitted preferences than the current allocated one.
 - If the higher preference is allocated, candidate will have to accept new allocated seat.

Mid-Entry

- If a candidate failed to apply for CSAS-2022 within the stipulated time and is desirous of participating later, can do so through the Mid-Entry window (whenever University) announces it), by paying a Mid-Entry fee of **Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable).**
- Mid-Entrants will not hold any right to claim the seats allocated to candidates. They will be considered for allocation only after all the candidates who had applied earlier and have the merit score/s higher than the lowest declared score have been given allocated.
- It is therefore, advisable to apply within the stipulated Application Phase

ADMISSIONS

To achieve optimal seat allocation and to avoid the situation wherein seats become vacant due to dropouts, in the first round of allotment, 20% extra allotments will be done in UR, OBC-NCL, EWS categories and 30% extra allotments will be done in SC, ST and PwBD categories for all programs in all the College. However, colleges where last year the withdrawals were less than 5% of the sanctioned strength, 10% extra allotments may be done for UR/OBC(NCL)/EWS and 15% in SC/ST/PwBD categories.

ADMISSION TO ECA AND SPORTS AND OTHER SUPERNUMERARY QUOTAS

- There are 26 Games/Sports under its Sports Supernumerary Quota and 14 categories (including NSS and NCC) under ECA
- 5% of total sanctioned strength of the College shall be allocated for ECA and Sports supernumerary quota of a College. The College can allocate between 1% to 4% to ECA and Sports, subject to a maximum of 5% intake of the College. In addition, not more than 20% seats of the earmarked seats of a quota shall be allocated to a single program
- For admissions to ECA and Sports Supernumerary Quota, Combined ECA Merit (CEM) and Combined Sports Merit (CSM) will be the basis for seat allocation
- Candidates must select the Program + College in which they wish to seek admission under ECA and Sports.

ADMISSION TO SUPERNUMERARY QUOTAS

- Other Supernumerary quotas include
 - Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD)
 - Children/ widow of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)
 - Kashmiri Migrants (KM)
 - Prime Minister's Scholarship Scheme for J&K Students (PMSSS)
 - Nomination of seats for Sikkimese Students (SS)
 - Orphans



ADMISSION TO BACHELOR OF FINE ARTS (B.F.A.)

- Admission to Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) in College of Art will also be done through the CSAS (UG) of the University
- The eligibility to this program includes scores obtained in CUET and a Practical-based test to be conducted in the College of Art
- The College offers BFA in six specialisations:
 - Applied Art
 - Art History
 - Painting
 - Print Making
 - Sculpture
 - Visual Communication
- A candidate can opt for any one specialisation. An additional registration fee of Rs. 400 (nonrefundable) will be charged for applying to BFA

ADMISSIONS TO POSTGRADUATE PROGRAMS

- Admission to all PG programs is through the CUET(PG) conducted by NTA
- PG BOI was published on 22.03.2023.
- The BOI contains eligibility criteria and the CUET Test papers that the candidates are expected to appear for admission to a concerned program
- Admissions to all PG programs will be done through a Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS (PG)-2023).

ALLOCATION AND ADMISSION TO PG PROGRAMS

- For the purpose of allocation, all candidates will be considered in the Common Merit List. For Category 2, students of UoD will be considered as per Program Specific Eligibility
- Highest Possible Preference will be provisionally allocated to a candidate considering Program-Based merit list, Social Category (UR/OBC-NCL/SC/ST/EWS/PwBD), and availability of seats
- CSAS policies such as Upgrade, Freeze, Mid-Entry will be applicable in PG allocations as well
- Registration to CSAS(PG) will commence after the declaration of CUET result, tentatively from the last week of June 2023

Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.)

- Candidates will have to appear either in a National level test such as UGC-NET/CSIR-NET/ any similar national-based test as mentioned in the Ordinance VI or its amendments issued by UoD OR in CUET(Ph.D.).
- Interview is mandatory for all Candidates.
- Ph.D. registration portal shall be opened more than one time in an academic year.
- Candidates who wish to appear in CUET(Ph.D.) 2023 may also register themselves. However, such candidates will be shortlisted for interviews only after the declaration of the result of CUET(Ph.D.) 2023-24 by NTA.
- On the recommendation of DRC and BRS, the Departments may hold interviews more than one time in an academic year of give equal opportunities to all eligible candidates. However, Candidates who would become eligible on the basis of CUET(Ph.D.) 2023 may be called only in the second phase of interviews, as conducted by the departments.

BACHELOR OF TECHNOLOGY (B.TECH.)

- Eligibility: Candidate must have passed Class XII from a single recognized Board. Candidates must have secured 60% or more marks in an aggregate of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics, and must have passed English (Core or Elective) as a subject of study at the Senior School Certificate Examination level.
- Admission: Admissions will be done through ranks obtained in JEE Main 2023.
- **Registration:** There will be a one-time Registration-cum-Counselling Fee of Rs. 1500/-
- Allocation: Allocation will be based on the JEE Rank as per the preferences submitted by the candidates.
- Commencement: Last week of June 2023.

Admission to the Bachelors programs of **School of Open Learning and Non-Collegiate**

Women's Education Board are based on the merit of the marks obtained in Class XII.



School of Open Learning is opening its admission portal for 8 Bachelors programs and 112 BA Program combinations.
