

Sir Shri Ram (1884-1963)

"Education is the key which is going to unlock the door to our greatness..."

Lala Shri Ram, the enigmatic visionary behind the institution, was born on April 27, 1884. The first son of Madan Mohan Lal and Chando Devi, Lala Shri Ram completed his education in Delhi. In 1909, the 25 years old Lala Shri Ram joined DCM. He possessed an analytical mind, an infinite capacity for work and a knack for human relations. During his life, Lala Shri Ram's main emphasis was on vocational, technical and women's education. As far back in 1920, he had decided to conduct the first experiment in vocation-oriented education by founding the Commercial Education Trust. The first school taken over by Commercial Education Trust was the Commercial High School. Commercial High School was raised in 1926 to the standard of an Intermediate College, in 1930 to a degree college and in 1934 to a post-graduate College. In 1942, Lala Shri Ram became the Chairman of the Governing Body of the College. By the year 1948, although comparatively young among the colleges of Delhi University, the Commercial College had the maximum enrolment possible under the University rules. In 1949, it was proposed to rename the College as 'Shri Ram College of Commerce' but it took two years to implement it due to the reticence of Lala Shri Ram.

Lala Shri Ram's association with the College continued till 1962, when because of failing health, he resigned. His health continued to deteriorate and he passed away on January 11, 1963. On the death of Lala Shri Ram, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, the then President of India said, "He was not only a great industrialist but helped many good causes. His contributions to education are memorable".

Deep down, he realized the importance of moving a step at a time, and therefore started so modestly in 1926. That modest beginning has now brought us to this august day.

We intend to actively move away from text book learning to research based learning, including field work, case studies, project work etc.

Under the aegis of the Centre for Professional Development, the College has been conducting focused short term courses for the students. We have organized faculty development programmes, workshops, and specialized lecture sessions. We are in the process of putting in place the ground work for offering Executive Development Courses, Customised Training Programmes, Consultancies etc.

The College has initiated grants for faculty research, and for publications in national and international journals. SRCC faculty and students can also avail of grants to present papers at seminars and conferences in India and abroad.

The Placement Cell worked tirelessly through the year and ensured more than 300 placements at the UG level for different profiles with about 50 renowned companies it gives me great pleasure to put on record that 100% of students of the GBO programme have been placed. We applaud their efforts.

4. Cells, Centres and Main College Units

Internal Quality Assurance Cell

Chairperson: Dr. R. P. Rustagi Coordinator: Dr. Rachna Jawa





In pursuance of the National Action Plan of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality upgradation of institutions of higher education, the NAAC proposed that every accredited institution establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC will become a part of an institution's system and work towards realizing the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of institutions. The IQAC will make a significant and meaningful contribution in the post-accreditation phase of institutions. During the postaccreditation period, the IQAC will channelize the efforts and measures of the institution towards academic excellence. The IQAC, SRCC will specifically focus on the creation of an institutionwide synergy imbibing the constituent efforts and feedback of the stakeholders viz. the teaching and non-teaching staff, the students, alumni, parents and others to generate quality sustenance and enhancement on the following areas as envisaged by NAAC:

- 1. Curricular Development
- 2. Teaching and Learning
- 3. Research and Consultancy
- 4. Infrastructure
- 5. Student Support and Services
- 6. Governance and Management
- 7. Innovation and promotion of Best Practices

The initiatives of the IQAC in the following have been detailed below:

a) Teaching-Learning

- 1. Internal Subject Meetings: The Teacher-incharge has been made responsible for ensuring subject-wise meetings for effective curriculum planning and delivery. The senior most faculty in a particular subject convenes the meeting and the minutes of the meeting detailing the action plan is sent to TIC and IQAC for review. To further strengthen the quality assurance in this regard, interdisciplinary subject meetings have been planned.
- 2. Courses and subject options: The viability of relevant add-on courses relevant for the students in the CBCS framework is being explored. The Centre for Professional Development in the college has been conducting similar short-term courses in the past.
- 3. Remedial Classes: The college has a dedicated center, Shri Ram Center for Personal Growth, which looks after the conduct of remedial classes in college. The subject in which student require additional classes are identified and faculty voluntarily contribute to solving the problems of students through remedial classes.

b) Administration and Governance

- 1. Initiation of the AQAR submission process: The IQAC is mandated to submit an Annual Quality Assurance Report to the National Accreditation and Assessment Council within one year of accreditation. The process for the same has been initiated with data collection from the various constituents of the college.
- 2. Semi-Annual meetings: To strengthen the quality framework in the college and create extensive feedback, the IQAC will hold semiannual meetings with the stakeholders of the college. It has been decided that such meetings will be held in the beginning of the semester. The first set of meetings with teaching and nonteaching staff had been held on 10th January, 2017.
- 3. Seminars: It has been proposed to hold seminars, workshops etc continuously for development of faculty. In the past year, Faculty development programme on E-filing of returns was held in the college. In this regard, a workshop on sexual harassment was conducted

on January 25, 2017 to generate awareness and facilitate discussion on the said topic.

4. Feedback Mechanism: A formal systematic feedback system has been put in place through the IQAC where feedback received by stakeholders are duly recorded with IQAC, and in case of complaints, forwarded to the concerned administrative office and due follow-up taken. Records have been maintained for the same.

c) Research and Consultancy

- 1. Creation of a separate student journal: To promote undergraduate research, a student journal has been created. Students contributing to the journal will be mentored by faculty on the research work and final submission.
- 2. Creation of a separate Consultancy Cell: The creation of a separate consultancy cell has been proposed to encourage faculty for consultancy assignments and facilitate tie-ups with the industry and government agencies.

d) Student Development

The following steps have been taken in respect of students development and progression:

- 1. Launch of a separate website for Placement Cell: A separate website has been launched to facilitate greater ease and speed in the placement process for undergraduate students. The website will also allow prospective employers to contact the placement cell in a simplified manner and will allow for better data management of students.
- 2. Attendance monitoring: An integrated attendance monitoring system has been proposed to ensure and follow up regular attendance in the college. Under this system, a notice/message shall be sent to the students and their parents on deviation from attendance rules without prior notification to the college.
- 3. Student Progression Records: The College has initiated the process of collection of student progression once they have graduated from the college. The progression records for the previous three undergraduate batches have already been recorded and further framework for collection and recordkeeping is being worked on.



d) Infrastructure

- 1. Proper cleaning and hygiene maintenance is ensured in the college through timely scheduling and supervisory follow-up. The campus and washrooms are cleaned four times a day under proper supervision. It is also ensured that the RO plants for drinking water are cleaned twice a month at regular intervals. Further, AMC's for the same have been renewed from time to time.
- 2. The set-up for the new Wi-Fi Facility has been taken up on an priority basis.

The Office of International Programmes organized programmes with various universities and international organizations viz., World Bank, UNESCO, International Cooperative Alliance and also in association with Ministry of Youth & External Affairs. During the academic session 2016-17, there were thirty-two programmes varying from one day, two days to one week and two weeks with an equal number of programme being held in India and abroad. A brief report is as follows:

1. SRCC University of Leeds Indo UK Initiative

The initiative featured a session on "Professional Development" by Ms. Louise Mustchin, Work & Employment Relation, Faculty of Business which focussed on leveraging LinkedIn to scale up the professional networking, recruitment, and professional development in contemporary world.

2. SRCC MDX Indo -UAE University Collaborative Programme

The Collaborative programme with MDX University included a campus tour, session by Ms. Camilla, Faculty of Middlesex University on Global Entrpreneurship. This was followed by presentation by MDX & SRCC students on the topic, International Business. There were presentation by Ms. AnjuVerma , Dr. Yusra Naseem and Ms. Sonal Thukral, Faculty of SRCC on the topic of Green Business and on SRCC International Programmes by Dr. Mallika Kumar. The programme culminated with the brainstorming session including quiz, cultural programme, and refreshments.

3. SRCC Indo Australian Meet

The programme fostered the young minds on the economic, social, political and technological advancements taking place in the India. Dr. Amit Sachdeva, faculty of SRCC and Mr. Raman Roy, the founder of Quattro, largest BPO in India discussed various aspects of how India became an innovative centre and experience of starting a business in India along with International competition, government regulation and many more. 5. SRCC NTU Indo Singapore Initiative

The programme included a two-hour lecture by Prof. Nilanjan Sen, Associate Dean, Graduate Studies Nanyang Technological University on "Financial Leadership" followed by a detailed interaction with students. Talking about the globalised world he used the concept of 'VUCA' i.e. Volatility, Uncertainty, Complexity, and Ambiguity to describe the current situation of the market. The session ended with Question A and an invitation for our students to NTU in the summers.

6. SRCC- MH -UBS Indo-Dutch Collaborative Programme

The programme was collaboratively organized by SRCC and Miranda House. Post the opening ceremony at SRCC, project responsibilities was allocated to student project teams, comprising of 2 students from the three different participating colleges. The students collected primary data and conducted an analysis on sustainability in business practices and among consumers. A paper recycling workshop was also organized for the participants. Excursions to various places around Delhi like The Embassy of Netherlands, Select City Walk, Saket, Gandhi Bhawan, etc. were organized. The students prepared creative projects which were presented to a panel of judges from SRCC, MH& UBS.Winners were announced & prizes were distributed to the first 2 teams in the felicitation ceremony.The penultimate day of the programme was marked by a cultural fusion with performances by students of SRCC and Miranda House.

7. SRCC Kings College Meet

Considering the significance of international relations & foreign policy, an informative session was conducted by Mr. Aditya Malkani, Country Head, Kings College London on 16th January 2017. Students were familiarised with the related issues where they were made aware of the opportunities available to strengthen international relations through Summer Schools that Kings College organises every year.

9. SRCC-UWEC INDO-US Collaborative Prog (Incoming):

The programme was inaugurated by honourable Vice Chancellor of University of Delhi, Prof. Yogesh K. Tyagi and Shri M.L Srivastava, JS, Ministry of Culture. During the programme, participants were divided into various buddy groups for carrying out research and making presentations The programme also included lectures, quizzes, case study competitions, activities, workshops, meditation and interactive sessions by faculty covering importance of India, evolution of various languages from Sanskrit, Business Models, importance of colours giving birth to beautiful designs, yoga, meditation and a lot more. The programme had visits to various businesses, educational and religious centres and a village, Nangli Razapur to help the students in their project work. The presentations, case study solutions and the projects were judged by faculty members. Certificate of participation and prizes were distributed at the end, followed by cultural programme.



10. Asia Pacific Workshop on University Cooperatives in SAARC(In association with International Cooperative Alliance)

Students of SRCC along with the Faculty Coordinator, Dr. Mallika Kumar participated in the International Cooperative Alliance-Asia Pacific (ICA-AP) workshop on University/Campus Co-operatives along with participants from SAARC countries. The workshop included case studies on the state of campus co-operatives from outside the SAARC regions well like Japan, Republic of Korea, Indonesia, Malaysia etc.. Besides case studies, knowledge on good practices on the subject were shared at the workshop that also features a joint working session to prepare an action plan for the SAARC nations.

11. SRCC NFUCA Indo Japanese Meet

Representatives from National Federation of University Cooperatives Association visited SRCC with students from various universities in Japan. After a campus tour to gain insights into the student life, there was an interactive session with our students on the Indo-Japan relations and the role of Student cooperatives in empowering the youth.

12.SRCC-MoY Indo-China Entrepreneurship Meet

This was a delegation of sixty members from China for an Entrepreneurship Meet through the combined efforts of SRCC and Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports which included brief series of presentations by students depicting the blooming startup culture and entrepreneurial spirit of the country, along with some initiatives taken by the Government to augment its impact.

13. SRCC India-USA Initiative 2016

The SRCC India USA Initiative (SIUI) 2016 was organised from 7th to 20th October, with the underlying theme, "Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Sustainability". Fifteen students accompanied by Faculty Organiser, Dr. Mallika Kumar participated in the programme. The Programme consisted of several paper presentations in seminars, active participation in lectures, panel discussions, classroom sessions and effective business pitch

presentation in front of esteemed judges. 14.SRCC World Bank Open Data Open DevelopmentWorkshop

The workshop was conducted by Ms.Sunita Malhotra from World Bank in the college auditorium. It appraised students with the database provided by World Bank and myriad tools for effective extraction of data. The usability of data was emphasized through various research-oriented examples.

15.SRCC Kyunghee University Indo Korean Initiative.

The session was conducted by Professor Young Jun Choi, the Associate Professor of Kyung Hee University, Republic Of Korea on Mobile Financial Services and their implications for developing economies. The need for better online connectivity to bridge the digital divide that exists in a lot of developing countries to ensure a globally integrated economy with top class facilities for all was realized. The session was followed by a question answer round discussing numerous aspects relating to the global proliferation of MFS and the need for government machinery to actively function and support start-ups providing MFS..

16. SRCC IESEG Indo French Interactive Session on Global Business Ethics

The programme included a session on importance of Global Business ethics by Prof. Stephen Murdoch, Associate Dean IESEG France followed by an interactive discussion between the students and Prof. Murdoch. Several Cases were dicussed from inside and outside the corporation like Sophie and Carling Ltd. France, Oliver and TranspacCorporation, Chinese Ventures etc.

17. SRCC Melbourne Indo Australian Meet

The Meet began with an elaborative presentation of activities undertaken by the Office of International Programmes. This was followed by detailed discussion between Australian delegates, SRCC faculty, and SRCC students of the prospects of the collaborative programmes between the two institutions. The success of the meet is now in its realization stage with short-term study, internships, mentorships, practicums research and seminar programme between SRCC and University of Australia in 2017Summer with possible funding from the Australian Government under the New Colombo Plan.

18. SRCC-University of Tsinghua Indo-China Meet

The programme included 27 Chinese students of diverse academic background from the University of Tsinghua along with their faculty coordinators. The interaction focused on the theme- 'Entrepreneurship and Leadership: An evolution towards revolution'. Mr. Jatin Srivastava, a serial entrepreneur having a rich and diverse experience of providing consultancy and growth solution to MSME, Government Departments, Social Sector entities and Startups across India talked broadly about how entrepreneurship can be fostered in today's youth from the time their education commences. This session witnessed lively exchange of culture, language and dance forms between the enthusiastic youth of the two countries. On the second day, there was a visit to the Chinese Embassy and the Cluster Innovation Centre of the University of Delhi.

19. Y20 Summit, (In association with MoY)

Two students of SRCC, selected by OIP, participated in The Youth Summit held in Beijing & Shanghai in China that witnessed youth delegates from G20 countries, guest countries as well organisations such as World Bank, IMF and OECD. The theme of the programme was "Youth Innovation for Our Shared Vision". The aim of the programme was at formulating youth policy for the G20 Countries and putting forward the concerns of the youth. The outcome of the summit is a



communique that is forwarded to the Heads of State of the G20 Countries for their consideration in formulating policy.

20. SRCC-Penn State Indo US Collaborative Study Programme

The Indo-US Collaborative Study programme 2016 between SRCC and Pennsylvania State witnessed 20 students from SRCC, 9 PSU counterparts (3 researchers and 6 students) to study 'Contrasts and Cohesions' in environment, politics, sports, technology and academics of India and the world. Visit to the Parliament of India and Parliament Museum threw light on Indian political framework while field visit to The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI), one of the largest developing country institution working towards sustainability and having affiliates across the world, educated the students about sustainable technology. The Rashtrapati Bhawan visit apprised them with Sir Lutyen's architecture. Excursions to Mughal Gardens, Red Fort, light and light show at Old Fort walked them through Indian history and culture. The lecture series comprised of a comprehensive discussion about the six topics of the project by SRCC faculty, Mr. Amit Sachdeva. Ms. Megan Wilkerson and Ms. Aparna Parnikar presented their research material on saving cocoa plants and call centre culture respectively. Mr. Richard Stoller, Coordinator of Pennsylvania State University also delivered an informative lecture. Mrs. Niti Bhutani, faculty, Hindu College spoke on gender inequalities and the role of property inheritance and about HUF (Hindu Undivided Family) in it. A panel discussion was conducted with the panelists, Mr. Ashwani Kumar, Dr. Hema Raghavan, exprincipal and ex-Dean, University and Ms. Payal Nagpal, ex-Academic Secretary, ILLL who spoke on subjects ranging from globalization, equality, cultivating humanity to having a 'discerning mind' which is the mark of true education. For the student's rejuvenation, a yoga session 'Healing through yourself' was conducted by Ms. Santosh Sabharwal, SRCC faculty. The 'Deans' dinner at the International Guest House with Mr. Srinivas, Dean International Relations, Mr. J. M. Khurana, Dean, Students Welfare and Dr. Amrita Bajaj, Deputy Dean, Students Welfare was also organized..

21. SRCC UNESCO Socio-Cultural Sustainability Dialogue

After Utrecht, the group visited Paris for a visit to the UNESCO office to have an interaction with the First Secretary and Permanent Delegate of India to UNESCO, Mr. Rakesh Adlakha. After the tour of the UNESCO building, there was a session with Mr Adlakha. He shared valuable insights about the inter socio-economic and cultural issues in the present times and the steps UNESCO is taking up to assist and help other countries. The students were also encouraged to join UNESCO as volunteers and do their bit to make a difference in the world.

22. SRCC-UBS-MH Indo-Dutch Programme

The Indo-Dutch Collaborative Program was held from 27th June to 1st July 2016 at Utrecht Business School, Netherlands. A group of 13 students, accompanied by Dr. Mallika Kumar, Faculty Coordinator, Office of International Programmes, completed a 5 day course on "International Strategic Management and Marketing. Following an introductory ice breaking session at the University with Ms. Jelly, Director of International Programs, HU and a brief presentation, the students were briefed about the LINKS Simulation Program on Strategic Management and Marketing and then divided into groups of 5-6 people. Each group consisted of members from SRCC, Miranda College and Utrecht Business School. The LINKS program was a simulation game where each team was given the responsibility to run a virtual company for 2 years managing all key decisions regarding product development, manufacturing, servicing, generating demand, research and development, market surveys etc. Students in each team took up roles as the Board of Directors and performed accordingly to compete in the dynamic market with multiple unseen factors and changers, testing their ability to predict, analyse and cope with market conditions. Apart from the LINKS Simulation game, a key focus of the program was to promote inter cultural exchange and harmony. During each course of the dinner, an interesting topic was given to the students to discuss from their own religion and region's perspective and listen to the others. HU also organised an excursion to ZaanseSchans, the

Placement Cell

Faculty Advisor: Mrs. Smita Sharma

This year, the Placement process for Shri Ram College of Commerce began in the month of August, open to a variety of job profiles like Investment Banking, Consultancy, Finance, Audit, Marketing, Sales, etc. This year turned out to be a success with a placement of 340 students with the highest package being 30 Lakhs per annum. Over fifty companies have visited the campus such as Deutsche Bank, Citi Bank, JP Morgan, Barclays Capital, McKinsey & Company, A.T. Kearney, etc. The first time recruiters included JP Morgan, Facebook, etc. The College saw the advent of many internship companies such as DSP Black Rock too. Companies from the finance sector worked out to be 20% of the companies on campus whereas consulting and banking companies had a share of 29% and 10% respectively. The average package increased from 6 Lakhs per annum to 6.5 Lakhs per annum for the year 2016-17.




The Computers and Mathematics Society

Faculty advisor: Mr. Amit Sachdeva



The society organised its annual event Harmony on 17th March, an inter college singing competition held in the seminar room with colleges across the University participating in it.


Another event Guesstimate held in October 2016. A guesstimate session was organised for the members of the society to them aware about the importance of guesstimate questions in today's corporate interviews.
